Dear Parents/Carers,

It is all our responsibility to act and do the right thing and this has helped to ensure our schools are safe and can remain open and fully staffed.

As always, if your child is ill, please let them rest and get better. However, should your child be isolating because of close contact with a positive case or a family member showing symptoms, please use your child's tapestry account to access work, tasks and challenges to ensure that your child is able to keep up with their learning. If you are not receiving any communication through tapestry, or have issues accessing content sent by your child's class teacher, please phone or email the school as quickly as possible so that we can help resolve this.

Online home learning

We have had great feedback from parents who have accessed some of our online platforms for learning, including programmes such as Reading Eggs and Mathletics. These can provide a great way to support your child at home, as well as at school, to catch up on lost learning time. This year, all schools have been allocated funds to spend on enhancing provision, to support children in making the best progress possible. As part of this spend, we have opted to purchase a subscription for every child, within the federation, to use both in school and at home. Your child will soon have a password and user name coming home for your use.

Is your child eligible for pupil premium funding?

Your child may be entitled to a sum of money, paid to the school, with the aim to boost their learning. This money is used by the school, to fund provisions with the aim of helping children in receipt of the pupil premium funding reach their best potential.

If you receive any of the following benefits you may be eligible:

Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)

Income support

Income-based jobseekers' allowance

Income-related employment and support allowance

Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

The guaranteed element of state pension credit

Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

There are many benefits to your child receiving pupil premium benefits, including <u>free</u> <u>uniform items</u> and <u>funding for school trips</u>. For a more comprehensive break down of how the federation spends this money, please see the pupil premium strategy, published on the website.

If you have any further questions, please speak with the school office team. They will be able to help you apply, or you can apply directly via the attached link and school will get notified if you are eligible:

Flu Vaccine

This year all children at Copythorne Infant School will be offered the opportunity to have the flu nasal vaccine in school. The school nursing team will be visiting on Monday 7th December to immunise those children whose parents have given their consent. Your consent needs to be given online this year due to Covid regulations and the link and codes to do this are below.

The unique code for your child's school is SH116282 Submit your form by 05/12/20 to ensure your child receives their vaccination. If you experience any problems accessing the form, telephone 02380 475221 and the team will be happy to help.

The vaccination is free and recommended for young children every year, and will be given by a quick and simple spray up the nose.
