# Dear Parents and Carers,

# Last Day

Our last day of term, this year, is Friday 18<sup>th</sup> December with our current end of day arrangements remaining the same. Our first day back at school will be Monday 4<sup>th</sup> January.

## **Policies**

Thank-you to everyone who has made comments on our proposed Behaviour, Relationships and PSHE policies. When we return, the school leadership team will be reflecting on the comments made and making amendments as needed. These policies will then be discussed further with the full governing body before being implemented in each of our schools.

## <u>Covid</u>

Firstly, I cannot express my thanks to all those who have communicated support and kind words in such challenging times. Such messages of kindness and thoughtfulness go a long way and are really appreciated. We, like schools all over the country, continue to navigate through the pandemic and work to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all our children and staff, remains a priority. There now seems to be light at the end of the tunnel and the possibility of returning to a sense of the old normal. However, until this time I would urge everyone to remain vigilant, support distancing measures and take appropriate action should you suspect a case of covid within your household (more information on this can be found on our website).

# Test and Trace

During the school holiday, all schools have been asked to support test and trace for 6 days after the last point of teaching. We therefore have to ask that should your child develop any symptoms (**within 48 hours after leaving school on Friday 18**<sup>th</sup> **December**), and subsequently receives a positive covid test result, it is imperative that you inform the school

immediately, in order for us to notify any potential contacts up to 3.15pm on 24<sup>th</sup> Dec.

Our admin team in Lyndhurst will be checking their emails daily, each morning by 10am, for any notifications of positive covid cases. So please email

**adminoffice@lyndhurst.hants.sch.uk** (you can also email directly using our school website). The last time the emails will be checked will be 3.15 on the 24<sup>th</sup> December.

PLEASE DO NOT PHONE YOUR SCHOOL OR LEAVE A MESSAGE ON THE SCHOOL ANSWERPHONE OR EMAIL ANY OTHER EMAIL ADDRESS AS THESE WILL NOT BE PICKED UP UNTIL JANUARY 4<sup>TH</sup> WHEN SCHOOL REOPENS.

In your email, please include your child's full name, class and school (as it may not be your , child's admin team who pick up the email), the date and time of when your child's symptoms started and please let us know if your child attended any before or after school provision, 48 hours before symptoms started.

I hope that everyone is able to keep safe and well over Christmas and continue to be prepared to support ongoing efforts to reduce transmission, if needed. Please note that the Lyndhurst email account will not be checked after 3.15pm on the 24<sup>th</sup> December until we return to school on the 4<sup>th</sup> January.

# Absence Notification

If your child is going to be absent, whether through illness, medical appointments, or for any other reason, please ensure that you notify the school office, even if you have told a member of staff in class, so that they can ensure the absence is recorded correctly, and to comply with our safeguarding responsibilities. You can phone the office and leave a message on the answer machine, use Parentmail to notify the absence or pop into the office. If your child is coming into school after 9.30, you will need to pre-order a school meal, or bring a packed lunch from home.

# Is your child eligible for pupil premium funding?

Your child may be entitled to a sum of money, paid to the school, with the aim to boost their learning. This money is used by the school, to fund provisions with the aim of helping children in receipt of the pupil premium funding reach their best potential.

If you receive any of the following benefits you may be eligible:

Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)

Income support

Income-based jobseekers' allowance

Income-related employment and support allowance

Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

The guaranteed element of state pension credit

Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit

and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

There are many benefits to your child receiving pupil premium benefits, including <u>free</u> <u>uniform items</u> and <u>funding for school trips</u>. For a more comprehensive break down of how the federation spends this money, please see the pupil premium strategy, published on the website.
