MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNORS

In addition they wish to acknowledge the equally important role played by parents, carers and families who are ensuring their children can access these opportunities to continue their learning journey at home. Furthermore they are managing this daily learning, which we know is not an easy task, alongside, in many cases, working from home themselves. This, together with the very real pressures of life during Lockdown, does not go unrecognised.

With school and home working together our pupils are in a good position to continue their learning while the present situation lasts. "

Is your child eligible for pupil premium funding?

Your child may be entitled to a sum of money, paid to the school, with the aim to boost their learning. This money is used by the school, to fund provisions with the aim of helping children in receipt of the pupil premium funding reach their best potential.

If you receive any of the following benefits you may be eligible:

Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)

Income support

Income-based jobseekers' allowance

Income-related employment and support allowance

Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

The guaranteed element of state pension credit

Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit

and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

There are many benefits to your child receiving pupil premium benefits, including <u>free</u> <u>uniform items</u> and <u>funding for school trips</u>. For a more comprehensive break down of how the federation spends this money, please see the pupil premium strategy, published on the website.
