
Parent questionnaires

Parking

A good number of schools have problems with car parking, but we are much more fortunate than most to have both the lay-by and the scout car park for daily use. We do pay for the use of the Scout car park, and we are very grateful to have the use of this facility which does then ease congestion at the lay -by car park.

However, can I remind you to please drive with extra care when using the lay -by car park. We have had a couple of 'near misses' lately due to careless driving including NOT adhering to the one-way system which operates in and out of the lay-by. Can I also remind drivers of overly long vehicles to park in the scout car park rather than the lay-by as space is very tight in the lay -by.

Is your child eligible for pupil premium funding?

Your child may be entitled to a sum of money, paid to the school, with the aim to boost their learning. This money is used by the school, to fund provisions with the aim of helping children in receipt of the pupil premium funding reach their best potential.

If you receive any of the following benefits you may be eligible:

Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)

Income support

Income-based jobseekers' allowance

Income-related employment and support allowance

Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

The guaranteed element of state pension credit

Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit

and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

There are many benefits to your child receiving pupil premium benefits, including <u>free</u> <u>uniform items</u> and <u>funding for school trips</u>. For a more comprehensive break down of how the federation spends this money, please see the pupil premium strategy, published on the website.
