#### **Book Week**

We were absolutely amazed at the amount of reading which took place over book week – both in school and out of school. Those who took part in the sponsored reading event – well done! We raised £600 which will be used to restock our current book supplies within school. All children who returned their sponsorship forms will be receiving a book mark as a well done for their efforts and as everyone did so well, all of the children will be able to help choose which books they would like to see in the school library.

#### **Phonics Checks**

Next term all Year One children, and those in Year Two who did not meet the phonics threshold, will be involved in the national phonics screening checks (the week beginning 6<sup>th</sup> of June). This is a short activity, undertaken with the class teacher on a 1:1 basis, which involves reading a series of words which can be 'sounded out' and words which need to be read at sight. If you would like any assistance on practicing phonics at home, please remember that reading eggs is a great resource to use.
