Morning Gates and security

We have a number of gates around school with various locks and codes on. This is to ensure that the site remains secure at the beginning and end of the school day but also during the school day. We use codes to ensure that in an emergency all staff members are able to quickly release locks and evacuate, if needed. Could we please ask, that at drop off and pick up, you support us by not allowing your child to play with or tamper the locks. This helps ensure that the locks do not get damaged and also supports behaviour expectations at school.

Rwanda

You may be aware, but earlier this year I was approached by one of our education directors at the diocese of Winchester and Portsmouth to accompany them on a learning exchange to Rwanda over the half-term holiday. We have talked to the children at school about this and they have helped prepare lots of things for me to take out and share with children in a variety of schools. This includes recorded songs, games, pictures and prayers, which we will show the children, in the schools we visit. In return the children we visit will do similar, for us to bring back and share with the children in our schools.

The trip is designed to not only support our ongoing curriculum but also with an aim of forging a link, which will support our young learners growing understanding of the wide world!

Hopefully your children will be able to talk about this as the coming weeks pass by, and despite what many children have said. I will be coming back after half term!
