## Attendance

We would like to remind all families of the importance of arriving at school on time each morning. Being punctual sets a positive tone for the day and helps students establish good routines, which are essential for academic success and personal growth. When students arrive late, they miss valuable learning time, disrupt the classroom environment, and may feel rushed or unsettled. Consistent on-time attendance also supports the development of responsibility and respect for others—skills that will benefit students throughout their lives.

We appreciate your partnership in ensuring your child starts each day ready to learn. Although our gates are open from 8:30, our school start time is 8:45. Any child who arrives after this time, without prior consent/agreement, is recorded as late. Children who arrive after 9:00 without prior consent/agreement are marked as having an unauthorised session for school attendance. ## Moving Year Groups

**For children moving on to Bartley:**

**June 2nd, 3rd and 4th** – Mrs Andrews (Year 3 Lead) and Bartley's SENCO will be visiting the federation schools to speak with teachers and visit each Key Stage 1 class.

**Tuesday 10th June** – Year 2 children will visit Bartley with a teacher from our school. This will involve an assembly and activity with Year 3 pupils.

**Wednesday 25th June** – Our teachers will meet with Bartley's Year 3 teachers to talk through each child, including next steps and learning behaviours.

**For our Year One and Reception children:**

We will begin talking about changes within the school day and exploring the feelings associated with change. Teachers will start visiting our Reception classes more frequently to read stories. During the week beginning 23rd June, the children will receive a letter from their teacher for next year; we will email the same letter to parents that day so you can see what has been shared with your child. Your child will then spend the mornings of Thursday 3rd and Friday 4th July in their new learning groups.

## Class Reports

Class reports will also be sent to parents on Friday 11th July, summarising your child's learning for the year. There will be an opportunity to discuss these further, for those who wish to, after reports have been sent. More details on this will follow after you have received your child's school report.
