In the season of Lent we have been building up to our Easter celebrations. The children have learned why we have pancakes and of course some participated in pancake races energised by eating a pancake! For those who were able to attend the Church services we hope that you have enjoyed seeing your children engage in these services. Thank you to Rev John and presently Pastor Paul for supporting us with these and the 'Open the Book' teams that visit the schools to run some worships.



Federation Improvement Plan

On our INSET day the staff focussed on learning more about The Empowerment Approach. From this day the staff in each school have focussed on a particular area to work on with the children empowering the children to understand that working together changes things for the better for everyone. We will be holding an information meeting about the approach in the Summer term.

As I stated in the last newsletter we had implemented retrieval in KS1 at the start of our maths lessons to help children to consolidate their prior learning. This term we have continued this and introduced it to our science lessons. We aim to continue this in our history and Geography lessons next term.

Over the Spring term we have continued to develop our maths offer by explicitly teaching mathematical vocabulary and selected stem sentences to support the children's mathematical understanding. The use of sentence stems has allowed us to continue to support the children's oracy in maths.

Support from NCETM and Hampshire maths advisors has given opportunities for CPD for teachers across the Federation, including some training on problem solving on our INSET day in Spring 1.

Mrs Day planned spirituality into a few of our worships to help children understand about thinking about themselves and also thinking about those around them.

Staffing

We would like to thank Mrs Thomas who returned from retirement to stand in as SenCo this term. We have appreciated her support across the three schools. You may still see her if she returns to do supply cover.

Next term we welcome Miss Allinson as our new SenCo. She is very experienced in this role and has been in for a couple of visits to start to get to know the children she will be supporting. Miss Allinson will also be sharing the role of class teacher with Miss Langton at Copythorne.

Miss Langton will resume in teaching the Hedgehog class from Monday to Wednesday and Miss Allinson will teach the class on Thursday and Friday.

We sadly have said goodbye at St Michaels to our teaching assistant Mrs McIntyre who has worked with us for a couple of years. She has returned to be with family in Mauritius. We will be welcoming new teaching assistant called Mrs Garner. who will start after Easter.

We have also said goodbye to Mrs Holmes our cover supervisor at St Michaels. We wish her luck in her new career. We are currently interviewing to fill this post and will let you know in due course who will be joining.



A Message from Miss Scotland

We have recently had a few questions about our reading procedures across the Federation and therefore thought it might be useful to clarify our practices and expectations. We follow the phonics scheme, Little Wandle. As part of this scheme, the children read their reading book 2-3 times weekly at school with a trained adult. When your child brings their book home on a Friday, they should already be very familiar with their book and therefore their reading with you is to 'show off' and show you the skills they have learned. Hopefully this should be a relatively quick and enjoyable experience. Whilst we understand that some parents may feel frustration that only one book per week comes home, this is recommended by Little Wandle in order to develop fluency and word reading automaticity. We would love for you at home to continue to develop a love for reading by visiting the library, sharing stories and in fact any other kind of print or storytelling experience, be this comic books, non-fiction or even audio books. We continue to strive to support every child to be a confident and fluent reader who enjoys entering the world of stories and from this, finds comfort, joy and a belief that quite anything is possible.
