Covid



If you are not receiving any communication through Tapestry, or have issues accessing content sent by your child's class teacher, please phone or email the school as quickly as possible so that we can help resolve this.

Online home learning

We have had great feedback from parents who have accessed some of our online platforms for learning, including programmes such as Reading Eggs and Mathletics. These can provide a great way to support your child at home, as well as at school, to catch up on lost learning time. This year, all schools have been allocated funds to spend on enhancing provision, to support children in making the best progress possible. As part of this spend, we have opted to purchase a subscription for every child, within the federation, to use both in school and at home. Your child will soon have a password and user name coming home for your use.



This year all children at Netley Marsh Infant School will be offered the opportunity to have the flu nasal vaccine in school. The school nursing team will be visiting on Friday 11th December to immunise those children whose parents have given their consent. Your consent needs to be given online this year due to Covid regulations and the link and codes to do this are below.

The unique code for your child's school is **SH116302** Submit your form by **09/12/20** to ensure your child receives their vaccination. If you experience any problems accessing the form, telephone **02380 475221** and the team will be happy to help.

The vaccination is free and recommended for young children every year, and will be given by a quick and simple spray up the nose.
