Dear Parents/Carers,

As the evenings get lighter and we see more of the sun, there is definitely a feeling of change in the air! It has been great to see all the children finish off this term back in school, learning together, with their friends (long may it continue!) Over the last three weeks, the teachers have been getting children moving on with their learning journeys and assessing the progress made over the Spring term.

Next term, we will be supporting every child to continue moving forward with their learning, filling any gaps and building on what they know, as we have always done. For some children, this may involve more focussed learning on reading, writing or maths. For others, it will be about supporting the rebuilding of friendships and helping children in developing their understanding of challenge, attitude to learning and resilience. I have mentioned before, that for those who would like to hear more about our curriculum for the next term and our approach to supporting children in such unusual times, I will be holding some short update meetings. Over the next term, our curriculum will be changed and adapted, to suit the needs of our learners and we will be teaching children key next steps, through mini themes – focussing on core skills in the morning and the wider curriculum in the afternoons. Next term we will also be holding parent consultation meetings, to talk about your child's next steps and how we can work together to ensure that your child continues to move forward.

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Covid Update

As restrictions ease and the rate of infection continues to drop, a sense of the old normality seems within our grasp! At the same time, it is really important that we continue to keep our guard up and ensure that we are all doing everything we can, in order to keep things this way. Please remember, that all parents and those providing childcare as part of a family's support bubble can now apply for Rapid Lateral Flow Tests, to regularly test yourselves for covid at home (you should have received a parent mail about this previously). Should **any** member of your household show any symptoms of covid, your whole household must isolate and seek a PCR covid test immediately.

Track and Trace over the Easter Holiday

Should any pupil show covid symptoms in the 48 hours following the end of school on Thursday, and subsequently test positive, it is essential that you inform the school, so that we can trigger our track and trace response. (please don't email Netley Marsh or Copythorne, as these emails may not be seen until we return to school after the holidays).

Support with heating costs, for families facing Winter hardship due to COVID-19 Information for Parents and Carers

As part of the connect4communities programme, the Citizens Advice Service is helping families and individuals with energy costs over the winter period – gas, electric and water.

The COVID Winter Grant scheme has been extended to 16 April, meaning this help is available for a few more weeks.

Please note that the local branch will complete a quick eligibility check and refer parents and carers to the distributors of the grant and financial support will be provided to the family or individual seeking help.

The eligibility criteria for this support - to heat homes - is wide-ranging to ensure the money is as accessible as possible and is as follows:

Families with children:

Families in receipt of benefits related free school meals

- Families including 16-18-year olds previously eligible for Free School Meals
- All children with a social worker
- All children open to Early Help
- All households with 2 4year olds accessing childcare and eligible for Early Years Pupil Premium

Households with a young carer

Those who it is believed will struggle to afford to heat their home adequately and/or maintain a reasonable standard of living this winter

Households without children:

Care leavers

Households that have been identified as going into debt for the first time Households or individuals with no other way of obtaining funds, e.g. those who face choosing to pay either rent or bills (considered unmanageable debt)

Those who it is believed will struggle to afford to heat their home adequately and/or maintain a reasonable standard of living this winter

Support from this fund, distributed by the Citizens Advice Service, can take the form of:

Pre-paid energy cards or the payment of a fuel bill on behalf of an eligible household

Is your child eligible for Pupil Premium funding

As you will be aware, all children at infant school are currently entitled to Universal Free School Meals.

However, for some of those children, schools will also be able to claim **Pupil Premium**, which will help provide further support. The criteria for eligibility is the same as the free school meal criteria from Key Stage 2 onwards.

If you think there may be any possibility that your child may be eligible for this funding, we would ask to check using the HC3S online service. Pupil Premium is an important payment for schools and a really good opportunity for eligible parents to get even more support for their children in school.

Applying for free school meals / pupil premium

You can check eligibility online at: https://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/hants

The service allows you to check your own eligibility for free school/college meals, or you can check on behalf of someone else.

The data you enter on the screen will be used to process your request. If your result comes back 'found,' your child is eligible for Pupil Premium and the system automatically informs the school.

This funding provides valuable support, so please do check your eligibility as soon as possible.

If eligible for this funding it can cover things such as the cost of school trips and we can provide you with a £25 skoolkit voucher for uniform and we may also be able to assist with other things too – just let us know!
