A Message from Mr Bowen

Many of you will know that just before half-term, two inspections took place within our Federation. Copythorne had its SIAMS inspection, and Saint Michael and All Angels had its Ofsted inspection. Although parents at these schools will have already seen the reports, I would like to share them with our whole Federation community, as they highlight the collective work of our staff across all three schools. We have worked hard to ensure a consistent approach across our schools so that teaching and learning remain of a high standard throughout the Federation. Therefore, even though inspectors focus on individual schools under their respective frameworks, the successes and targets identified apply across all of our schools.

Netley Marsh has also been inspected by our Local Authority Learning Partner, who supports school improvement across the Federation. Our inspection partner could not believe the levels of engagement in our reception class, who were all focused on all the different areas of learning happening simultaneously in class. He was also really impressed by the development of our mathematical vocabulary within Math Lessons in butterfly and Bumblebee class. Again, our partner inspector comment on the consistency of strong practice which he has seen within all our schools across the Federation. Well done Netley Marsh Team!

We continue to strengthen our maths curriculum through our work with the Solent Maths Hub. We are seeing excellent progress, with pupils demonstrating stronger retrieval of mathematical language in every lesson. This year, we have recorded the highest percentage of pupils making accelerated progress in Years 1 and 2 in many years—an achievement we are incredibly proud of.

For those of you were able to attend our forum on the future of our schools in the current education landscape, you know that there are many challenges currently facing schools. We were thrilled that again, we have attracted many more children from outside our catchment area, which ensures that our schools continue to move forward and reflects the hard work of all the Federation team. This is a growing area of focus, and I was fortunate enough to be invite to the houses of parliament this term, to be part of working group exploring the benefits and challenges of small rural school working. I continue to be really proud of the work my team does each and every day and any additional support to continue developing the work we do, is always a blessing.

At last, we were blessed with good weather for our Year Two inter-federation football competition! A huge well done to St Michael and All Angels, who took home the trophy this year!
