Dear Parents,

The end of term has reached us again and, once again, I can't believe how fast the time has gone! In a time where so many things have stood still, it is amazing how fast all the children have settled, progressed and normalised all the changes made. My thanks, to all the team, within our Federation, who have worked tirelessly to ensure that we can continue to provide a safe and stimulating environment for children, where our pupils can continue to learn and develop, as well as provide a sense of normality in what would otherwise seem very strange times.

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Last Day

Our last day of term, this year, is Friday 18th December with our current end of day arrangements remaining the same. Our first day back at school will be Monday 4th January.

Policies

Thank-you to everyone who has made comments on our proposed Behaviour, Relationships and PSHE policies. When we return, the school leadership team will be reflecting on the comments made and making amendments as needed. These policies will then be discussed further with the full governing body before being implemented in each of our schools.

Covid

Firstly, I cannot express my thanks to all those who have communicated support and kind words in such challenging times. Such messages of kindness and thoughtfulness go a long way and are really appreciated. We, like schools all over the country, continue to navigate through the pandemic and work to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all our children and staff, remains a priority. There now seems to be light at the end of the tunnel and the possibility of returning to a sense of the old normal. However, until this time I would urge everyone to remain vigilant, support distancing measures and take appropriate action should you suspect a case of covid within your household (more information on this can be found on our website).

Test and Trace

During the school holiday, all schools have been asked to support test and trace for 6 days after the last point of teaching. We therefore have to ask that should your child develop any symptoms (within 48 hours after leaving

leaving school on Friday 18th December), and subsequently receives a positive covid test result, it is imperative that you inform the school immediately, in order for us to notify any potential contacts up to 3.15pm on 24th Dec.

Our admin team in Lyndhurst will be checking their emails daily, each morning by 10am, for any notifications of positive covid cases. So please email <u>adminoffice@lyndhurst.hants.sch.uk</u> (you can also email directly using our school website). The last time the emails will be checked will be 3.15 on the 24th December.

PLEASE DO NOT PHONE YOUR SCHOOL OR LEAVE A MESSAGE ON THE SCHOOL ANSWERPHONE OR EMAIL ANY OTHER EMAIL ADDRESS AS THESE WILL NOT BE PICKED UP UNTIL JANUARY 4TH WHEN SCHOOL REOPENS.

In your email, please include your child's full name, class and school (as it may not be your child's admin team who pick up the email), the date and time of when your child's symptoms started and please let us know if your child attended any before or after school provision, 48 hours before symptoms started.

I hope that everyone is able to keep safe and well over Christmas and continue to be prepared to support ongoing efforts to reduce transmission, if needed. Please note that the Lyndhurst email account will not be checked after 3.15pm on the 24th December until we return to school on the 4th January.

Parent meetings

Next term, we are aiming for parent meetings to take place during the week beginning 22nd March. More information on this, will follow nearer the time.

Website

Our hope is that you can all enjoy quality family time, rest, relax, reconnect and share in the excitement and magic of Christmas.

As the children return to school, and learning starts to accelerate again, I hope you will all continue to make best use of our online platforms, such as reading eggs and mathletics. Phonics

Due to the disruptions last year, the government have asked for all Year Two pupils to take the Year One Phonics Screening Check. This is a simple check, consisting of 20 real and 20 pseudo words, which is aimed at identifying children who may benefit from additional phonic support. As a school we have to report on our outcomes to the department for education and you will be (if not already) receiving a letter letting you know of your child's outcome before the end of the term.

Update news




Year 1 Woodpeckers

We wish you a very merry festive period and are looking forward to getting back to the learning in the New Year!








Year 2 Owls



Community Christmas Decorations






