Phonics Checks

Next term all Year One children, and those in Year Two who did not meet the phonics threshold, will be involved in the national phonics screening checks (the week beginning 6th of June). This is a short activity, undertaken with the class teacher on a 1:1 basis, which involves reading a series of words which can be 'sounded out' and words which need to be read at sight.
