## A Message from Mr Bowen

## Federation News

It has been a busy half-term across all our schools, and unfortunately, a wave of illness has affected both pupils and staff. As many of you will know, this has led to occasional staffing challenges. These situations often arise unexpectedly, sometimes only becoming clear once I am already on my way to school. When this happens, our priority is always to ensure that teaching and learning continue smoothly.

One of the key benefits of having mixed-age classes is that teachers collaborate closely, delivering the same lessons across different classrooms. This helps minimise disruption to learning. However, it also means there is sometimes little time to notify parents of staff changes before the school day begins. We appreciate your understanding when these situations arise, as they are unavoidable.

Last week, Copythorne underwent its statutory SIAMS inspection. I would like to extend my thanks to all the parents who provided feedback and spoke with the inspector, as well as to the whole Oaks team, who work together to ensure that provision is the best it can be. We were extremely pleased with the positive feedback received and look forward to sharing the inspector's findings with the entire Oaks Federation community.

We have also had a visit from Ofsted at St Michael & All Angels. Thank you to all the parents who took the time to speak with the inspectors and complete our parental survey. The inspector commented on the positivity of the feedback from the families we serve and we were all very grateful for all the lovely comments! We are looking forward to sharing the outcomes of the inspection as soon as we are permitted.

Well done to our Year 1 and 2 pupils who took part in our Inter-Federation Dodgeball Festival! The games were full of energy and excitement, and the children worked hard during their practice sessions with ACE Sports. We are thrilled to announce that Year 1 teams from Copythorne and Netley Marsh shared first place this term, while Netley Marsh won in Year 2. Fantastic effort from everyone!

## Staffing Changes

While we are extremely happy for Mrs Buchan, our finance officer, we are also (very selfishly) sad to announce that she will be retiring at Easter. After 31 years of dedicated service at Copythorne and across the wider Federation, she will be greatly missed by both staff and families.

Following a rigorous recruitment process, we are pleased to announce that Miss Instrall, currently based at St Michael & All Angels, has been appointed to the role of Federation Finance Officer. She will begin a transition period with Mrs Buchan after half-term. As a result, we welcome Mrs Anglaret, who will be joining St Michael & All Angels School as our new admin officer at Lyndhurst.

Additionally, we have appointed Mrs Wheeler to replace Mrs Abbot at Copythorne. She will be working in Fox Class alongside Mr Cooper. We warmly welcome her to the Copythorne team!

## Toys and Precious Items

We completely understand that, from time to time, children like to bring items from home. However, we would like to advise parents not to send their child into school with toys or precious items, as we cannot guarantee their safety. It is very natural for young children to lose items, forget where they put them, drop and break things, or pick up something attractive and pop it in their pocket (be it a pebble or a ring). Although we absolutely believe that part of development at school is taking responsibility and learning right from wrong, this is a developmental process for all children. Therefore, before sending any personal item to school with your child, we ask you to consider: how would they feel if it was lost or broken? This is always a possibility for any item brought into school.

## Celebrating Learning Together

### Reception

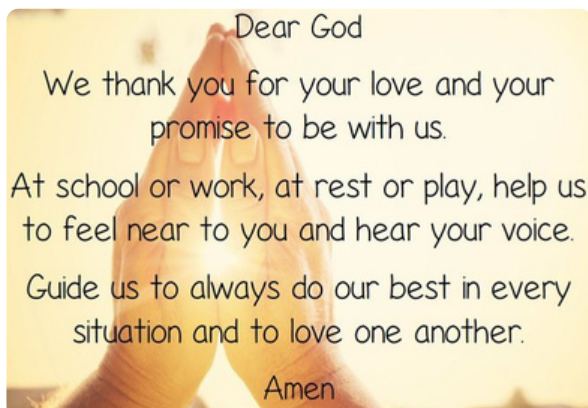
