Staffing

Mrs Maclaurin will be leaving at the end of this term she has worked at all our schools in the Federation and has contributed so much over the years. She has been year 1 lead and most recently the Inclusion Lead. She will be missed by us all but we wish her all the best in her new teaching post.

We have successfully recruited Miss Allinson as our new Federation Inclusion Lead for three days a week and class teacher at Copythorne 2 days a week. She will share the class teacher role with Mrs Langton. Miss Allinson will start after Easter.

During the spring term Mrs Langton will teach full time and we welcome Mrs Thomas back who resume her role as Inclusion lead across the Federation for two days a week.

Miss Bridle at Copythorne will also be leaving at the end of this term. She has been fantastic in her role supporting different children's learning needs. We wish her lots of success in her new job. We will be recruiting someone in January to take on her role.

From January Mr Warren currently our Federation year 2 lead will become the Federation Key Stage 1 lead.

School Tours

Although our official tours have ended, we are still happy to show prospective families around our schools and share more about the work we do. We have places available in various year groups across the Federation. Please encourage anyone seeking a school place – whether for September or mid-year – to get in touch.

Federation Improvement Plan

This term all staff across The Oaks Federation have undergone training on The Empowerment Approach. This training will begin to shape our approach to managing behaviour and supporting children in managing their readiness for learning. This term we have introduced the children to 'the 5C's' (comfortable, connected, control, count and capable). These are a key component of the approach and in time we would like the children to understand that if our 5C needs are being met, we feel good and we are ready to learn. Over the year ahead we will begin to look at the 5C needs in more detail and will also share information with you to help you best support your children in becoming happy, settled and curious learners.

We are all supporting children's learning by implementing retrieval practice at the start of each maths lesson. The aim of this is to support consolidation of learning and develop children's confidence in maths. We will start to look at retrieval practise in Science next term.

Mr Warren as maths lead is continuing to work with staff in developing their maths planning, teaching strategies and use of resources to further support children's learning He is working with support from outside agencies including the maths county advisor.

Our focus on spirituality is now led by Mrs Day and this term she has spoken to and met with advisors from the Diocese. Next term as a staff we can begin to develop opportunities to envelop spirituality into our curriculum and everyday experiences.

Courageous Advocacy

This term the children took part in Children in Need. As a Federation we raised £267.

Families across the Federation also supported our Samaritans Purse – Operation Christmas Child. We received shoeboxes filled with toys, and personal care items. These were then taken to the donation centre to be passed on.

At Harvest time the children also considered those in our local communities by bringing in a variety of tins and non-perishables for the local food banks.

We are proud of the children's response and acts of compassion.

Clubs

As you are aware we needed to find a new company for our after school provision. We have successfully secured a great provider 'Superstar Sports UK'. They will start in the second week of January; you should have received information about this. The clubs will run from Monday to Thursday. Next term you can access gym club, football, basketball and stage school. Please remember that you need to book through this organisation not the school. We can use the PE premium to fund places for our KS1 children, however the premium does not cover children in the reception year so parents/carers will need to pay for these places. As the stage school club is not a sport, parents/carers will need to pay for this experience.
