Respect – Sharing best practice respecting each other to reach true collaboration – ensuring best practice in teaching is distributed within all schools within the Federation, resulting in a consistent pedagogy, in order to truly evaluate the impact of provision on outcomes and support staff in their constant **pursuit of excellence**, resulting in high outcomes for all children.

Compassion – standing in a child's shoes - Ensure our curriculum is appropriate for every child, taking into consideration age, stage of development, individual need and inclusivity. Also that we **preserve the wonder of childhood**, with a curriculum that is driven by children's interests and builds children's cultural capital while developing a love of learning.

Courageous Advocacy – Children develop an understanding that we can make a positive difference in the world and that every act of kindness is a positive step to a better world – preparing us to be future ready to make the world a better place.

#### Success criteria

- All themes begin with a hook and finish with an exit point
- All themes plan for real life experiences, including off site visits, trips, visitors, wow moments.
- Children are offered a wealth of experiences beyond academic study
- Clear partnership with families, which support lifelong learning beyond the school day
- Further opportunities to engage families in everyday school life are evident.

### Success criteria

- All schools achieved Global Neighbours, bronze award.
- Levels of behaviour are consistently high as children can articulate how their behaviour can make others feel
- Children can talk about the impact of their actions , including charity work, acts of kindness etc
- Children recognise when others are making a difference and celebrate this.
- All stakeholders are able to articulate how our vision and values impacts on the running of the schools within the federation and provide examples of how our vision and values make a positive impact on the lives of our pupils, families, staff and wider community.
