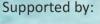

Key achievements to date until July 2019:

- 1. Partnership Working- Engagement with the NFSSP (New Forest School Sport Partnership. Increased pupil participation in competitive activities. Networking with other PE leads in the area to share best practice.
- 2. Hire qualified coaches to teach PE and sport. Qualified coaches have been supporting teachers in developing their P.E curriculum and supporting the current P.E lead in her role in raising the profile of P.E across the federation.
- 3. Widen opportunities for children to experience a variety of different sports out of school.
 - Various clubs are run outside of school by ACE sports, including football. football, netball, dodgeball etc.
- 4. Getting children more active throughout the day. Weekly lunch time activities and after school clubs coordinated by ACE Sports coach. Introduction of 'Sport Leaders' for children to encourage their peers to engage with sport during playtime and lunch times (encouraging ownership/leadership and increasing participation of the least active)
- 5. REAL Jasmine purchased to enhance quality of provision for children, develop the subject through a holistic approach, provide CPD for staff, develop a progression of skills and assessment tool for staff.
- Development of resources to enhance provision- interactive boards in the halls, Bluetooth systems for outdoor lessons, equipment purchased to follow REAL P.E programme.

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

- Continue competitive competition, through the programme provided by NFSSP and the development of competitions across the Federation. With a particular focus on engaging the least active children.
- Promote REAL PE across the Federation-provide training and support for staff to implement the ethos across the school, teaching strategies. and the assessment tool. Reflect on how well this is going and think about next steps.
- Raise the profile of Sport and P.E across the Federationcommunication with parents, celebrating successes, involvement of sport personalities and outside agencies, implement daily mile and active 'fit breaks' during the school day.
- Use external providers to provide additional sporting experience outside the normal curriculum remit
- Promote idea/opportunities for children to be more active during playtimes – use of markings etc.
- Promote the amount of time teachers are promoting exercise within the classroom teaching day.
