## KS1 Spring 2 History: Fire! Fire!



Choose from the menu three exciting activities to do at home.

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Get Creative!</b></p> <p>Build London in 1666! Can you make a model of a house from the time of the Great Fire of London? Houses were made from wood and were very close together. Use Lego, cardboard, junk modelling or blocks, thinking about the tall, narrow houses.</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Oh, the places you'll go!</b></p> <p>Explore London! London looks very different today compared to in 1666. Use a book, video or website to explore London. Can you find <b>St Paul's Cathedral</b>, the <b>River Thames</b> and <b>Pudding Lane</b>? Draw or write 3 facts you find out about London.</p> 
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Reading Adventure</b></p> <p>Read to discover the past by reading a book from home or the library about <b>fire, the past, London</b> and <b>helping people</b> (e.g. firefighters). Talk to an adult about what you have learnt.</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Sing out loud!</b></p> <p>Learn a song or rhyme about the Great Fire of London. Can you teach it to someone in your family? Extra challenge: Clap or tap to show how the fire spread from house to house.</p> 
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Out and About</b></p> <p>Be a fire safety detective! Look around your home for fire safety items (smoke alarms, fire doors, exits) and draw or list what you find. How are these things different from 1666?</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Amazing Maps</b></p> <p>Follow the fire! Draw a simple map showing the River Thames, Pudding Lane, where the fire started and where it spread. You could use arrows to show the fire's journey, add labels and use colours to show land, river and fire.</p>
